Chesney Doyle

As a volunteer, Chesney Doyle is founder and president of the nonprofit group, F.O.R. NATCHEZ (Friends of the Riverfront), which aims to revitalize Downtown Natchez through consensus-building, city planning, and strategic action. After gaining the unanimous support of the Natchez Board of Aldermen in 2015, the group raised private funds to contract

a professional planning team to engage the community and the leadership, hone a common vision, and produce an action plan. The resulting Downtown Master Plan, officially adopted by the City in 2018, is currently being implemented pursuant to the strategy outlined in the Plan. In 2018, the Downtown Natchez Master Plan received the highest honor given by the American Planning Association (MS Chapter) for "The Year's Most Outstanding Plan."



Rachael Carter

Dr. Rachael Carter is an economist for the Mississippi State University Extension Center for Government & Community Development. Her work focuses on economic development, natural resource policy, tourism and local foods marketing through her Extension program, Growing Your Brand. She has worked for over 15 years in community and economic de-

velopment and she provides analysis and education for elected officials at the city, county, state, and national level. She has led multiple national, statewide and regional economic development initiatives.



Laura Jane Giacagglia

Laura Jane Giaccaglia received her B.S. in Family and Consumer Sciences from Delta State University in 1996. She majored in Child Development and minored in Special Education. She later received her M.S. in 2002 from Mississippi State University in Health Education and Health Promotion. Her career with Mississippi State University Extension

Service began in 1999 where she started as a 4-H Agent in Coahoma County. She currently serves as the Extension Coordinator and Extension Agent for Bolivar County and her focus area is in Family and Consumer Sciences and Community Resource Development. She is a six time Congressional Award winner including both the Governor and Lt. Governor Award for various 4-H conservation projects. She received the Excellence in Promoting Rice Award from USA Rice Fedaration.



Ann Tackett

Ann Tackett is the Aberdeen Main Street manager. Her work is to guide her community in downtown economic development that strengthens our economic assets-design (beautification), retail promotion ,and organization by building partnerships among the community that have a stake in the commercial district. She has worked with Main Street since

2013 but has been a community activist for many years with anything pertinent to making Aberdeen a better place to live.



Lauren-Colby Nickels

Lauren Colby Nickels is an Instructor for the Mississippi State University Extension Center for Technology Outreach. During her two years with MSU-ES CTO, she has specialized in digital technology outreach and online marketing using web and social media outlets. She is one of 3 Instructors in Mississippi who teach nontraditional workshops on the im-

portance of digital technology. She has been selected for numerous public speaking opportunities to engage business owners and organization leaders on the importance of digital marketing, outreach and cyber security.



Dr. James Barnes

Dr. James Barnes is an Extension economist. His work largely focuses on business development in communities using three Extension programs, including: 1) Bricks-To-Clicks™; 2) Local Food System Economies; and 3) Local Flavor. He is a certified marketing guide and copywriter for StoryBrand, an online marketing framework used to

help businesses clarify their marketing messages so customers will listen. He teaches online marketing using StoryBrand's framework to businesses throughout Mississippi communities. His research focuses on branding, online and social media marketing, agribusiness management, local food system economics, and rural development issues.



Regina Charboneau

Regina is a Mississippi maven. Born and raised in Natchez, Mississippi, the River runs through her veins. Chef Charboneau has worked as a camp cook in the bush of Alaska, created and owned restaurants in San Francisco, been chef de cuisine on a set of luxurious vintage railway cars, served as the culinary director of the American Queen River-

boat, and written cookbooks. It did not matter if Regina was living in Alaska, Paris, or San Francisco because she brought the South and Southern Cooking with her. A key figure in the American food scene in California that happened in the 80's, she opened the eponymous Regina's at the Regis in 1985. In 1995, Regina created Biscuits & Blues nightclub in San Francisco. Featuring classic southern cuisine and live music nightly, Biscuits & Blues has won multiple WC Handy awards for Best Blues Club in America. Biscuits & Blues is still going strong today, having celebrated its 24th year in February of 2019.



Senator Lydia Chassaniol

Senator Chassaniol has served since 2007 and is Chairwoman of the Senate Tourism Committee, where she has shown considerable leadership in helping to develop tourist markets within individual communities throughout the state. Chassaniol also serves as Vice Chairman of the Senate Corrections Committee. In addition, Senator Chassaniol

serves on the committees for Agriculture, Drug Policy, Elections, Ethics, Finance, Investigate State Offices and Municipalities. She is a former art teacher who worked in public and private schools, in addition to serving as Director of the Communities in Schools program in Greenwood and Leflore County Schools for two years. Still active in the community, Senator Chassaniol currently serves on the Mississippi Blues Commission and on the board of Cottonlandia Museum. She is a long serving Rotarian and has participated in a literacy project with the local schools for many years.



Senator Chris Massey

Chris Massey was raised in the Mississippi Delta before moving to Desoto County. Chris has represented Desoto County in the Mississippi Senate since 2011. He serves on the Ethics, Housing, Education, Finance, Highways and Transportation, Labor, Municipalities, Wildlife Fisheries and Parks and the Senate Tourism Committees.

Chris is Vice President of the family business where he has worked with his parents for 34 years. He is a Certified Professional Builder and Certified Green Professional. He has also served as President of the Home Builders Association of Mississippi. Chris and Cathy have been married for twenty-eight years. They are the parents of Katie (married to Taylor), Dalton and Morgan. Grandparents of Brentley.



Representative Becky Currie

Becky Currie has been in the Legislature for 3 terms and will be starting her fourth term in January 2020. She is a Registered Nurse of 40 years. Becky Currie serves as Chair of the House Tourism Committee and also Chair of PEER Committee. She is also the first President of the Ms House Conservative Coalition. Other committees that she

serves on are Elections and Reapportionment, Medicaid, Education and Ways and Means.



Webster Franklin

Webster Franklin grew up in the Mississippi Delta and now calls Tunica, the northernmost county of the Delta, his home. He attended the University of Mississippi and graduated in 1990 with a Bachelor of Arts degree. Upon graduation he was employed in the White House for the George Bush administration where he served as an advance representative

for Vice President Dan Quayle and executive assistant and personal aide to Mrs. Marilyn Tucker Quayle. In 1994, Mr. Franklin became the first paid Executive Director of the Tunica County, Mississippi, Chamber of Commerce. He was responsible for drafting and lobbying for passage of the special legislation creating and funding the Tunica County Convention & Visitors Bureau.



Emily Havens

Emily Havens is the Executive Director of GRAMMY Museum® Mississippi and has served as the Director since January 2015. Prior to accepting the position, Emily served as on the Board of Directors for the Cleveland Music Foundation, that owns and operates the Museum, for more than 3 years. Emily comes to the museum from an 18-year career

as an Executive with the Chickasaw Council, Boy Scouts of America. Emily has a Master of Science in Community Development Degree from Delta State University. She is a member of Board of Directors for the Chamber of Commerce, Crosstie Arts, and the Cleveland Rotary Club and is a Paul Harris Fellow. Emily has served as President of the Rotary Club, President of the Cleveland Country Club, and on the Board of Directors for the GRAMMY Museum® Mississippi. She is a member of the Covenant Presbyterian Church in Cleveland. Emily and her husband, Lee, have a son, William and two daughters, Elizabeth Gray and Anna Patrick, and live in Cleveland, Mississippi.



Malika Polk-Lee

Malika Polk-Lee first came to the B.B. King Museum and Delta Interpretive Center in 2012 as its chief administrative officer. Her strong background in corporate management was beneficial in her role of overseeing daily operations of the museum, which included financial reporting, personnel, purchasing, strategic planning, the development of edu-

cation and outreach programs, and fundraising and donor development. After the departure of the museum's executive director in 2015, Malika was the choice to step into that position. Darrell S. White

Darrell S. White is Director of Cultural Heritage Tourism for the City of Natchez, as well as Director Emeritus of the Natchez Museum of African-American History and Culture. He is widely recognized as a researcher and lecturer on subjects pertaining to the history

of the people of African origin in South West Mississippi from the 1700's until today. His talents have been utilized by agencies of the federal, state and local governments, as well as national and inter-national media outlets. He has also worked extensively over the years as a historical re-enactor portraying the lives of the known and unknown people of African origin throughout history. His has performed at the Natchez Little Theater, the annual Angels on the Bluff program, and numerous PBS documentaries.



Tami Reist

During her more than three decade long career in the tourism and travel industry, Tami has lived by the theme expressed by the famous American heroine Helen Keller, "Alone we can do so little, together we can do so much." This theme is carried forth in all of her

speaking engagements across the country and has had proven results in her professional accomplishments. Tami is the President/CEO of the Alabama Mountain Lakes Tourist Association (AMLA). Her duties include planning, implementing, directing, and evaluating all promotional programs as well as overall development of the tourism and travel industry within the 16 northernmost counties of the State of Alabama. 


Willy Bearden


